- Focus on whole-life service, engaging with the fringe and equipping the whole church for evangelism and service in the church and in the world

Some prayerfully considered concrete aims for the next year, recognising God's sovereignty and our frailty:

- Begin to clarify our governance structures in order to ensure a Biblical pattern of church leadership with meaningful input from the wider church family
- Review our staffing to ensure the staff team is as wellequipped as possible to facilitate our vision, especially in perceived areas of weaknesses
- Review our work with teenagers and consider possibilities in engaging some of them in the evening service
- Introduce our new church management system,
 ChurchBuilder, to assist with communication and admin
- Repair the balcony and return to normal use
- Review sound/AV technology in the building and consider the possibility of projection screens for services
