Further Application Questions - Titus 3:1-11

- Do you think the public perception of Christians today aligns with verses 1-2? Why might Christians be *tempted* to relate to the state and their neighbours in this way?
- According to verse 3, why will followers of Jesus "show all humility to all people"?
 (In the Greek, this verse begins with the word 'because'). How does Paul describe the vertical and horizontal effects of sin?
- How do verses 4-7 give further reasons why Christians must "show true humility to all people"? What did our Triune God do, and what did we do?
- According to verse 8, what will be the effect of continually teaching about the grace shown to us by our Triune God? How does this contrast with the effect of the legalistic ministry being rebuked in verses 9-11?
