- How does the cross save us *from* sensuality and to sanctification? What aspect of the gospel do you need to be reminded of? How can others help with this?
- How do we need to contend for the truth faith (v.3) in the church? How does Jude give us practical guidance in v20-21? What does it look like for us to live this out as a church family?
